1. In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, the authorities imposed restrictions at Hyderpora in Srinagar to prevent people from paying tribute to the creator of famous slogan 'Hum Pakistani Hain, Pakistan Hamara Hai' and symbol of resistance, Syed Ali Gilani, on his first martyrdom anniversary, today.
 2. Syed Ali Gilani remained firmly committed to the Kashmiris' freedom cause and his pro-Pakistan stance throughout his life. He had to endure unspeakable hardships at the hands of Indian oppressive regime for championing the Kashmiris' cause of right to self-determination. The veteran leader spent more than two decades in jail or under house detention. Even he was under house arrest when he died at his Hyderpora residence on this day, last year.
 3. The occupation authorities deployed Indian Army, police and paramilitary personnel in strength in Srinagar, particularly in Hyderpora area, to prevent people from assembling at the grave of the martyred leader and offering Fateha for him. The forces' personnel threatened shopkeepers against closing their shops and businesses as part of shutdown call for which was given by the All Parties Hurriyat Conference and supported by other organizations. However, defying orders, the traders closed their businesses at many places in Srinagar and other areas of the Kashmir Valley.
 4. Seminars and rallies were held in Azad Kashmir, Europe and other parts of the world where Kashmiri are present in large numbers to remember Syed Ali Gilani for his unparalleled sacrifices for the Kashmir cause.
 5. APHC-AJK chapter took out a rally at National Press Club, Islamabad, while Syed Ali Gilani's martyrdom anniversary was officially observed in Azad Jammu and Kashmir. A huge procession was taken out from Burhan Wani Chowk to Garhipan Chowk in Muzaffarabad to eulogize the sacrifices and services of the veteran leader in the Kashmir freedom movement.
 6. The data issued by the Research Section of Kashmir Media Service, today, said Indian troops in their unabated acts of state terrorism martyred nineteen Kashmiris in the last month of August. Among the victims, eight youth were martyred in fake encounters. 150 civilians were arrested during 171 cordon and search operations and many of them were booked under black laws in the month.
 7. Activists from IIOJK, today, staged a hunger strike at New Delhi's Jantar Mantar to push for restoration of the special status of Jammu and Kashmir. The demonstrators deplored that a forced silence has been maintained in IIOJK at gunpoint, and they on behalf of Kashmiri people have come to New Delhi to knock the door of Indian Supreme Court to undo the Modi's illegal actions of August 05, 2019.

1. World rights watchdog, Amnesty International, has said that Narendra Modi-led Indian government intensified the repression of human rights in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir during the last three years since it revoked the special status of the territory on August 05, 2019.
 2. The Amnesty International in a report released, today, said that journalists, lawyers and human rights defenders in IIOJK were facing increasingly harsh and repressive measures by the Indian government. It said that at least 27 journalists had been arrested since August 5, 2019, with several of them, including Fahad Shah, Aasif Sultan and Sajad Gul were rearrested after court ordered their release and booked under draconian law, Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. Aakar Patel, chair of the board of Amnesty International India, in a statement said for three years now, civil society and media in Jammu and Kashmir have been subjected to a vicious crackdown by the Indian government, which is determined to stifle dissent using draconian laws, policies and unlawful practices in their arsenal.
 3. Meanwhile, Anjuman Auqaf Jamia Masjid, Srinagar, in a statement strongly denounced the occupation authorities for keeping its chief Mirwaiz Umar Farooq under continued house arrest and preventing him from offering Juma prayers. The Mirwaiz is under house arrest for the last over three years.
 4. Senior leader of All Parties Hurriyat Conference, Maulana Abbas Ansari, was admitted in Soura Institute of Medical Sciences in Srinagar after his health deteriorated, today.
 5. A non-Kashmiri labourer was injured after he was shot at by unknown gunmen in Ugergund area of Pulwama district, today. Soon after the incident, Indian troops and police personnel cordoned off the area and launched searches to nab the attackers.
 6. On the other hand, a Bharatiya Janata Party leader was shot dead by unidentified persons inside a cloth showroom in Sadar Bazaar area in the Indian city of Gurgaon. Unknown persons fired upon the BJP leader, Sukhbir Khatana alias Sukhi, when he went to the showroom with his friend.
 7. Following widespread protests, the police have arrested the top Hindu religious leader of Karnataka's politically powerful Lingayat community in Chitradurga district in connection with sexual abuse allegations leveled against him by two minor girls. The arrest came amid protests especially by Dalit community over police inaction for close to a week since a sexual assault case was registered against Shivamurthy Murugha Sharanaru, the head seer of the Murugha Math, one of the key Lingayat seminaries in Chitradurga, with a group of advocates writing to the high court stating the investigation is not being carried out in an unbiased, free and fair manner.

1. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference has urged the international community, particularly the United Nations, to hold India accountable for grave human rights violations and war crimes being perpetrated by its troops in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
 2. The APHC spokesman in a statement issued in Srinagar maintained that Narendra Modi-led fascist Indian government after repealing the special status of IIOJK on August 05, 2019 has virtually turned the territory into an open-air prison where all the basic rights and freedoms of the people have been usurped. He said killings, arrests, torture and other atrocities during house raids and cordon and search operations by Indian troops on a daily basis have made the life of the Kashmiri people a hell. The spokesman added that a recent report by the Amnesty International on the grim human rights situation in IIOJK should serve as an eye-opener for the world community.
 3. Indian police arrested an innocent youth from a check-post at Shangergund in Sopore area of Baramulla district. The police dubbed the youth as a militant to justify his illegal detention.
 4. Narendra Modi-led fascist Indian government had claimed that the repeal of special status of IIOJK will give impetus to the development in the territory, but the ground situation after the passage of three years is contrary to these assertions. Data from a private research firm the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy reveals that the unemployment rate in IIOJK reached 32.8 percent in the month of August, which is the highest in the last several years. As per experts, the unemployment in the region has been on the rise since the August 05 move by the Indian government.
 5. A Dalit man was killed by his in-laws for marrying an upper caste woman in Almora district of the Indian state of Uttarakhand. Tehsildar of Salt sub-division in the district Nisha Rani said that a Dalit political activist from Panuadhokhan village, Jagdish Chandra, was found dead in a car in Bhikiasain town on Friday.
 6. Hindutva goons assaulted the imam of a mosque and forced him to chant Hindu religious slogan 'Jai Shree Ram' in Ghaziabad city of the Indian state of Uttar Pradesh.
 7. The family members and lawyers of incarcerated activist-scholar, Atiqur Rahman, who had undergone heart surgery in November, last year, have said that he has become "partially paralysed" due to lack of medical attention in the prison. Atiqur Rahman and three other persons were arrested in October 2020 when they were on their way to Hathras village of Uttar Pradesh where a Dalit woman was raped and murdered by four upper caste Hindus.

1. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference has denounced the custodial killing of a mentally-challenged resident of Azad Jammu and Kashmir, Tabarak Hussain, by the Indian army in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
 2. Tabarak Hussain was shot at and arrested by the Indian troops after he unintentionally crossed the the Line of Control in Nawshera area of Rajouri district, last month. He was martyred in the custody of the Indian army, yesterday. As part of Indian nefarious attempts to defame Pakistan at the international level, Indian officials had claimed that Tabarak Hussain was bribed to attack an Indian army post in IIOJK. However, some videos of Tabarak Hussain had emerged on social media in which he seemed to be quite an abnormal and mentally-challenged person. In some of these videos captured while he was at his home in Azad Kashmir, he had been seen tied with ropes and chains so that he could not harm himself or other people.
 3. The APHC spokesman in a statement issued in Srinagar said torturing innocent Kashmiris to death has become new normal in the occupied territory. He added that Tabarak Hussain was mentally ill, which the Indian authorities knew as he had also mistakenly crossed the Line of Control six years back and was returned through Wagah border. The APHC urged the international community particularly the United Nations to hold India accountable for war crimes being perpetrated by its troops in occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
 4. Indian police arrested a religious scholar from a seminary Madeenatul Uloom at Dadpeth in Kishtwar district of Jammu region. The scholar identified as Abdul Wahid, a resident of Cherji Dool tehsil of the district, was a staying with his wife and a son in a house adjacent to the madrassa, where he was working as religious teacher. He has been arrested on the ridiculous charge of presence of people from across the Line of Control and religious content in his whatapps and facebook accounts.
 5. A Central Reserve Police Force man died under suspicious circumstances in Karnah area of Kupwara district.
 6. National Conference President Farooq Abdullah visited Soura Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar, and enquired after the health of senior APHC leader Maulana Abbas Ansari. KMS

1. In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, the Modi-led fascist Indian government could not digest the celebrations made by the Kashmiris after Pakistan's win over India in the Super 4 match of the Asia Cup 2022 at Dubai International Cricket Stadium on Sunday night and in retaliation launched crackdown operations every in nook and corner of the territory.
 2. Streets in Srinagar and other parts of the territory erupted in jubilation on Sunday night soon after Pakistani batsman played the winning stroke. Overjoyed Kashmiri youth took to the streets in groups despite the fact that the personnel of Indian army, police and paramilitary forces were already deployed to prevent the celebrations. The youth shouted pro-Pakistan and pro-freedom slogans and fired crackers. In videos, circulating on social media, youth are seen cheering and dancing, carrying Pakistani flags while the sky is lit with huge firework. Indian troops, throughout the day, kept on raiding houses of the youth seen in the videos celebrating the Pakistan's victory in the Kashmir valley and Doda and Kishtwar districts in Jammu region.
 3. Also, it is happening only in India under Modi where an Indian player is labeled as 'Pakistani' or 'Khalistani' for his religious background after Indian cricket team loses a match against Pakistan. This time, 23-year-old cricketer Arshdeep Singh was the target of the BJP-social media brigade after he dropped a catch in the match. He was branded as "Khalistani" because of his Sikh origin. Some social media users demanded that Arshdeep be sent to Pakistan.
 4. Police, today, found a bullet-riddled body under mysterious circumstances in an orchard in Narpora area of Shopian district. The occupied territory is witnessing a sharp increase in the phenomenon after revocation of Jammu and Kashmir's special status by India in August 2019.
 5. Senior APHC leader Professor Abdul Ghani Butt has called for settlement of the Kashmir dispute through a sustained dialogue process among all stakeholders to mitigate the sufferings of the Kashmiri people they are going through since 1947. Professor Butt who visited the residence of senior Hurriyat leader Maulana Abbas Ansari in Srinagar and inquired after his health, hoped that the world major powers would facilitate the solution to avert a big catastrophe in the region.
 6. Renowned intellectual and Kashmir freedom movement stalwart, late Shaikh Tajammul-ul-Islam was remembered on his first death anniversary, today, for his valuable and matchless services to the Kashmir cause. An event in this regard was organized by Kashmir Media Service, which he served as Executive Director till his death.

1. In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, Indian troops in their fresh act of state terrorism martyred two Kashmiri youth in Poshkreeri area of Islamabad district, today.
 2. The youth were martyred during the massive ongoing cordon and search operations, being carried out by the troops across the Kashmir Valley and parts of Jammu region.
 3. Alongside the military operations, sleuths of India's dreaded State Investigation Agency backed by personnel of Indian police and paramilitary Central Reserve Police Force conducted multiple raids in Awantipora, Pulwama, Shopian, Islamabad and Baramulla districts, today. Locals complained that during the raids, the SIA sleuths are particularly targeting innocent youth on unfounded charges. Besides harassing the inmates, the Indian forces' personnel confiscated mobile phones and other belongings of the Kashmiri people.
 4. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference leaders including Abdul Samad Inqilabi, Khadim Hussain and Sibte Shabbir Qummi in their statements condemned the killing of two youth and harassment of Kashmiris in unrelenting military operations. On Pakistan Defense Day, today, the leaders paid tributes to the martyrs of 1965 for writing a golden chapter of bravery in the history of wars against enemies.
 5. Peoples Democratic Party President Mehbooba Mufti addressing a party meeting in Srinagar expressed the resolve to fight for the resolution of the Kashmir issue and restoration of Articles 370 and 35 A. She called upon the Narendra Modi-led Indian government to hold dialogue with Pakistan to settle the Kashmir dispute and open trade routes like Muzaffarabad and Rawalakot.
 6. A protest demonstration was held in Udhampur against the killing of a Sikh man, Karan Singh, in Panchari area of the district. The protesters blocked the Udhampur-Panchari road. Body of the Sikh youth was found hanging from a tree after an Indian special police officer visited his house in Panchari and threatened to kill him.
 7. APHC-AJK chapter at a meeting in Islamabad, today, urged the international community to initiate proceedings against India under war crimes committed by its forces in HIOJK. The meeting was held to pay tribute to eminent scholar, champion of Kashmir cause and former Executive Director of Kashmir Media Service Sheikh Tajammul-ul-Islam on his first death anniversary.

1. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference has deplored that Narendra Modi-led fascist Indian regime is systematically implementing its settler colonial plan on the Israeli pattern to efface the Muslim identity and establish Hindu civilization in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
 2. The APHC spokesman in a statement issued in Srinagar said the abrogation of Kashmir's special status was aimed at paving the way for the Hindus from India to get permanently settled in the territory. He said, the extrajudicial killing of innocent Kashmiri youth on a daily basis is part of Modi's communal plan to turn the Muslim majority Jammu and Kashmir into a minority area.
 3. Peoples Democratic Party President, Mehbooba Mufti in a tweet said the occupation regime has given verbal orders for registration of non-local labourers and Indian forces' personnel as voters in the occupied territory. She said, the verbal orders were passed at a meeting in Baramulla by district Tehsildar. Around 2.5 million Indian nationals are likely to be added to the electoral rolls during the exercise.
 4. Washington-based World Kashmir Awareness Forum President Dr Ghulam Nabi Mir addressing a panel discussion at the 59th convention of Islamic Society of North America in Chicago regretted the failure of United Nations to implement its resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir that has led to continued suffering of the Kashmiri people. The Convention was attended by more than 10,000 people who came from all across the US and Canada. He warned that the future of South Asia remains in peril as unresolved Kashmir dispute involves three nuclear powers - India, Pakistan and China.
 5. In his address as special speaker at the ISNA convention, the founder and President of the world-renowned human rights organization Genocide Watch, Dr Gregory Stanton, said that India is preparing for genocidal massacres of 200 million Muslims. Dr Stanton said India has met all of the preparatory stages for more genocidal massacres. He pointed out that persecution of Muslims is reflected in termination of Kashmir's special status. He deplored that a climate of impunity reigns, in which eyewitnesses to mass murders of their own families have been terrorized into recanting testimony, and the killers have been acquitted.

1. The Modi-led Indian regime has shifted 150 more detainees from Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir to jails in Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, New Delhi and other states of India under a secret plan.
 2. Most of these detained youth have been slapped with draconian laws, Public Safety Act and Unlawful Activities Prevention Act. Majority of these detainees were lodged in high-security Kotbhalwal jail, Jammu. Indian media reported that some of the detainees are residents of Azad Jammu and Kashmir, who had mistakenly crossed over the Line of Control into the occupied territory on different occasions. The Modi regime has ordered the jail authorities in Uttar Pradesh, New Delhi and Haryana to lodge these Kashmiri youth in a complete isolation. More people will be shifted from IIOJK to jails inside India in the days to come.
 3. The London-based British Broadcasting Corporation in a special report lifted veil on the less talked-about issue of forcible snatching of private vehicles of Kashmiri civilians by the Indian Army to use them in fake encounters and cordon and search operations in the occupied territory. As per BBC report, in many cases the owners are not only deprived of their vehicles, but also arrested and subjected to inhuman torture at Indian army camps. The BBC correspondent visited 15 villages of Shopian, Pulwama and Kulgam districts, and found that army snatches private vehicles, as and when it desires, and no one can dare to refuse out of fear of reprisals.
 4. India's dreaded National Investigation Agency has filed a chargesheet against eight Kashmiris in a concocted case in a special court in Jammu. The chargesheet was filed against these youth, all residents of Pulwama district, on the ridiculous charge of being over-ground supporters of mujahideen. Locals in Pulwama commenting on the NIA's claim asked whether all Kashmiri people are over-ground workers since they all support the freedom of their motherland from the Indian bondage.
 5. Speakers at a function organized by APHC-AJK chapter in collaboration with the Kashmir Media Service in Islamabad, today, called upon the United Nations and the international community to bring top Indian leadership to book for its crimes against humanity in occupied Jammu and Kashmir. Prominent among those who addressed on the occasion included Farzana Yaqoob, Mahmood Ahmad Saghar, Ghulam Mohammad Safi, Muhamamd Farooq Rehmani, Syed Faiz Naqshbandi and Syed Yousuf Naseem.

1. Narendra Modi-led fascist Indian government has intensified its attempts to efface the Muslim identity of Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir and impose Hindutva ideology of Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh and other extremist Hindu organizations in the territory.
 2. Backed by the communal Modi regime, the Hindutva goons of RSS and Bajrang Dal have forcibly occupied a piece of Muslim Waqf land in Rajouri town. They are also not allowing the reconstruction work of a historic mosque in the town. At the same time, the Hindu extremists have constructed a Hindu temple after forcibly occupying the land of a mosque in Samba district.
 3. The occupation authorities imposed curfew in Rajouri town, today, to prevent the Muslims from holding demonstrations against the grabbing of Wafq land by the Hindu extremist groups. Local residents told the media that police vehicles patrolled the town throughout the day, asking people not to come out of their homes. They said the movement of vehicles in the town was also restricted. The situation in the town has been tense since yesterday morning after the Hindutva goons attempted to occupy Muslim Waqf land.
 4. Meanwhile, the All Parties Hurriyat Conference leadership in a statement in Srinagar strongly denounced the Modi regime for shifting over 150 more illegally detained Kashmiris from IIOJK to the various Indian jails hundreds and thousands of miles away from their homes. The APHC leadership termed the move as the worst display of victimization to punish the freedom-loving Kashmiris for challenging India's illegal occupation of their homeland.
 5. The occupation authorities deployed additional Indian troops and police personnel outside the Nigeen residence of senior APHC leader, Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, and disallowed him to offer Juma prayers at historic Jamia Masjid, Srinagar. Pertinently, the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha in a recent interview said that the Mirwaiz was not under house arrest. The Mirwaiz is under house arrest since August 2019.
 6. An Indian soldier committed suicide, today, by shooting himself with his service rifle at an army camp in Nagam area of Badgam district. This incident raised the number of such deaths amongst Indian troops and police personnel in the occupied territory to 553 since January 2007.

1. The Jammu and Kashmir Democratic Freedom Party, headed by incarcerated senior APHC leader Shabbir Ahmad Shah, has strongly condemned the systematic killing of innocent Kashmiri youth by Indian troops to turn the Muslim majority of Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir into a minority. The DFP in a statement in Srinagar termed the ruthless killing of Kashmiris as part of the Narendra Modi-led fascist Indian government's sinister plan to change the demographic composition of IIOJK. It deplored that on one hand, India has let loose its troops to kill innocent Kashmiris while on the other, it has intensified its attempts to disempower the Muslim majority by permanently settling the Indian Hindus and granting voting rights to the non-local labourers and Indian forces' personnel in the territory.

2. Indian police arrested four innocent youth, Shakir Akber Gojree, Mohsin Wani, Himayun Shariq and Faizan Ashraf, from a check-post at Gousiabad Chowk in Chinkipora area of Sopore town of Baramulla district. The police dubbed the arrested youth as over-ground workers of a mujahid organization to justify their illegal detention.

3. Mahmood Ahmad Saghar, and General Secretary, Shaikh Abdul Mateen, in a joint statement issued in Islamabad denounced in strong terms the continued killing and arresting of Kashmiri youth and shifting of political detainees from IIOJK to various Indian jails. They described the shifting of the Kashmiri prisoners to the Indian jails as the worst display of victimization to punish them for opposing India's illegal occupation of their homeland.

4. In yet another act of anti-Muslim bias, the Indian Supreme Court refused to entertain a plea seeking the arrest of Bharatiya Janata Party leader Nupur Sharma over her derogatory remarks against the Holy Prophet (peace be upon him). Instead, the court asked the petitioner to withdraw the plea.

5. The family of an 8-year-old boy arrested in Barharia city in Siwan district of the Indian state of Bihar has said that the police are demanding money for his release. The police had arrested the boy, Rizwan Qureshi, along with his grandfather from a local mosque following anti-Muslim violence during a Hindutva rally in the city on Thursday.

9. The briefing was co-hosted by Genocide Watch, World Without Genocide, Indian American Muslim Council, Hindus for Human Rights, International Christian Concern, Jubilee Campaign, 21Wilberforce, Dalit Solidarity Forum, New York State Council of Churches, Federation of Indian American Christian Organizations of North America, India Civil Watch International, International Commission for Dalit Rights, Center for Pluralism, American Muslim Institution, Students Against Hindutva Ideology, International Society for Peace and Justice.

1. In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, the All Parties Hurriyat Conference leadership has appealed to the United Nations and international human rights organizations to stop India from killing innocent youth in fake encounters under a wicked plan.

2. APHC leaders including Syed Bashir Andrabi and Ghulam Nabi War in their statements in Srinagar expressed concern over shifting of dozens of illegally detained youth from occupied Jammu and Kashmir to far-off jails inside India. They feared that Modi-led fascist government could eliminate these youth in detention as it has extra-judicially killed Tabarak Hussain, Zia Mustafa and many other youth in Jammu jails. Tabarak Hussain and Zia Mustafa like many other youth were picked up by the Indian army from the jail and killed in custody. The APHC leaders sought the intervention by the United Nations and global human rights watchdogs to save the lives of the detained Kashmiri youth.

The People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration at a meeting in Jammu decided to set up a committee to chalk out the future strategy on the inclusion of non-locals in the electoral rolls of Jammu and Kashmir. This was stated by Alliance's chairman Farooq Abdullah while talking to the media at his residence in Jammu after the meeting. Peoples Democratic Party chief Mehbooba Mufti, among others, also attended the meeting. Farooq Abdullah deplored that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi was imposing new laws on the people of Jammu and Kashmir with every passing day.

4. The National Conference vice president, Omar Abdullah, in a statement issued in Srinagar said that his party would continue fighting for restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's special status. He hoped that Indian Supreme Court would hear the petition challenging the abrogation of Article 370 on merit as it is a strong case.

5. Agence France-Presse, a French-based international news agency headquartered in Paris, has exposed baseless propaganda launched by Indian media against Pakistan at the behest of Modi government. The AFP in its fresh report said that a video being circulated in Hindi-language social media posts that claim it shows a brutal assault against a Hindu woman in Pakistan. 'This is false', the AFP report said and added that the footage being circulated since January 2022 is about a land dispute in Pakistan. As per AFP, the video was tweeted by the verified account of Indian media outlet Zee Hindustan on August 27, 2022 with misleading subtitles that 'atrocities against Hindus are not stopping in Pakistan.' The French news agency proved with facts that the dispute was between two Muslim families based in Sialkot, and had nothing to do with any Hindu woman.

1. In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, Indian troops in their fresh act of state terrorism martyred one more Kashmiri youth in Shopian district, today.
 2. The troops martyred the youth during a cordon and search operation in Heff Shirmal area of the district. The locals took to the streets against the killing who were retaliated with fire by the troops. A senior police officer confirmed the firing by the troops.
 3. Indian government has decided to set up FM radio stations near the Line of Control and international border to wage propaganda against Pakistan and the ongoing Kashmir freedom movement. The decision was made by the Indian Home Ministry.
 4. Peoples Democratic Party Chief Mehbooba Mufti in a statement in Srinagar rejected the former Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad's assertion about Article 370 and said that Jammu and Kashmir's special status would be reinstated, one day.
 5. Mehbooba Mufti's daughter Iltija Mufti addressing a function in Jammu called upon the Modi government to hold talks with Pakistan and the All Parties Hurriyat Conference to find out the permanent solution of the Kashmir dispute. She also suggested opening of Jammu and Kashmir borders to make the region an economic hub.
 6. India's Supreme Court, today, dismissed a petition filed by the father of a fake encounter Kashmiri victim, Amir Magrey. However, the court ordered the authorities to pay Rs 5 lakh to the victim family in compensation. Legal experts ridiculed the Indian top court's ruling and said that the compensation itself proved that victim Amir Magrey was innocent and was killed extra-judicially. Amir along with three other innocent youth was martyred by Indian troops in a fake encounter in Hyderpora area of Srinagar in November 2021.
 7. APHC-AJK Convener Mehmood Ahmad Saghar in a statement urged the international rights organizations to put pressure on India to release all illegally detained Hurriyat leaders and activists languishing in different Indian jails.
 8. Former APHC-AJK Convener Muhammad Farooq Rehmani's new book "Kashmir kay Khoonchukan Mah wa Sal [Bloody Months and Years of Kashmir]" has been launched in Islamabad. The book throws light on the past and present of the Kashmir dispute.

1. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference leadership has warned India against the conspiracies being hatched by the RSS-backed ruling Bharatiya Janata Party to grab land and properties of Jammu and Kashmir Waqf Board across Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
 2. The APHC leadership in a statement issued in Srinagar said the BJP, which has virtually taken over control of the Waqf Board through its handpicked chairperson, also intends to snatch the land of Eidgah, Srinagar, which is revered by the Kashmiris for its historical Martyrs' Graveyard and hundreds of years' religious association with it. The RSS and BJP nexus, the Hurriyat leadership added, wants to convert Jammu and Kashmir Waqf Board into a major tool to finance and implement its evil agenda in the occupied territory.
 3. The APHC leadership pointed out that the BJP is taking into possession all religiously and politically significant places and positions in the Kashmir valley to efface its Muslim identity, while in Jammu its patron RSS is openly imparting military training to its cadres in the name of Indian army-sponsored 'Shakha Sangam' programme to carry out a 1947-like massacre of Muslims in the region.
 4. Peoples Democratic Party President Mehbooba Mufti interacting with various delegations in Jammu blamed the Modi regime's policies for growing public anger in IIOJK.
 5. Jammu and Kashmir Peoples League in a statement expressed deep concern over the deteriorating health of illegally detained APHC leader Muhammad Yasin Attai. The Hurriyat leader has been suffering from serious ailment at Sopore police station for the past 15 days. However, the authorities have not provided him with basic medical facilities.
 6. Three boys suffered injuries when an unexploded shell, deliberately left behind by Indian army, went off in Heff Sermal area of Shopian on Tuesday. The army conducted a cordon and search operation in the area, last night.
 7. A protest demonstration was held at the Jammu University campus over the racial discrimination of a university professor, Chander Shekhar Chandra, by the administration because of his low-caste background that led him to take his life, the other day. Shouting slogans, the protesters blocked the road for many hours.

1. Incarcerated Vice Chairman of All Parties Hurriyat Conference, Shabbir Ahmad Shah, has taken strong exception to the malicious attempt by the authorities in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir to seize Srinagar's Eidgah land and other Waqf Board properties across the territory.
 2. Shabbir Ahmad Shah in a message from New Delhi's infamous Tihar Jail which was released in Srinagar deplored that after snatching every right from Kashmiris, the RSS-backed Modi's fascist government is encroaching upon the Waqf Board lands and properties, which is also an infringement of the religious affairs of the Muslims. Owing to religious and historical importance, he said, Eidgah and Muslim shrines are sacred places for Kashmiris and they would resist tooth and nail any attempt to desecrate them.
 3. APHC leader, Khawaja Firdous, in a statement in Srinagar strongly denounced the unabated killing of innocent youth by Indian troops and urged the international community to declare India a terrorist state for its crimes against humanity in IIOJK.
 4. Peoples Democratic Party President, Mehbooba Mufti, addressing a press conference in Jammu said the BJP has turned Jammu and Kashmir into a big prison where people are not allowed to speak freely, journalists and human rights activists are jailed while politicians are silenced.
 5. At least 12 persons were killed and several others injured after a minibus skidded off the road and plunged into a deep gorge at Bareri nullah in Poonch district, today.
 6. Chairman of Democratic Hurriyat Forum, Chaudhry Shaheen Iqbal, at a meeting with Hurriyat AJK leaders in Rawalpindi stressed the need for building international pressure on India for settlement of the Kashmir dispute in its historical perspective.
 7. In Geneva, a group of Kashmiri delegate met the UN Special Rapporteur on the right to development, Saad Alfarargi, on the sidelines of 51st session of the United Nations Human Rights Council and briefed him on how the absence of any meaningful political engagement in Kashmir has resulted in isolation and marginalization of the Kashmiris. The delegation appealed to the United Nations Human Rights Council to use UN mechanisms to protect the life and dignity of the Kashmiri people.

1. The All Parties Hurriyat Conference has expressed serious concern over the upsurge in Indian state terrorism in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir.
2. The APHC in a statement issued in Srinagar said killings, arrests, torture, destruction of property and other atrocities by Indian Army, police and paramilitary personnel during house raids and so-called cordon and search operations have become a routine matter in the territory. It pointed out that Indian forces' personnel have turned the Jammu and Kashmir once called a paradise on earth as a hell for its inhabitants. The APHC appealed to the international community to take cognizance of grim human rights situation in IIOJK and play an effective role in resolving the Kashmir dispute in accordance with the Kashmiris' aspirations.
3. APHC leaders including Abdul Ahad Parra, Zamruda Habib, Yasmeen Raja and Dr Musaib in their separate statements demanded immediate release of all illegally detained Kashmiris languishing in different jails of IIOJK and India.
4. A report released by Kashmir Media Service on the occasion of International Day of Democracy, today, said India has proved itself a fake democracy by suppressing with brute force the Kashmiris' right to self-determination guaranteed by several resolutions of the UN Security Council. It pointed out that despite facing the worst Indian brutalities for the last 75 years, the Kashmiri people are determined to carry on their struggle till they achieve their democratic rights.
5. Indian police arrested an innocent Kashmiri youth during a search operation in Reasi district of Jammu region, today.
6. In Geneva, a Kashmiri delegation during a meeting with Organisation of Islamic Cooperation permanent representative Ambassador Nassima Baghli and counselor Salima Dalibey on the sidelines of the ongoing 51st session of the UN Human Rights Council sought urgent attention of the international community towards the fast deteriorating human rights situation in IIOJK. The delegation members said it is high time that the world should take cognizance of India's settler colonial plan to change the demographic composition of the territory. The delegation included Altaf Hussain Wani, Syed Faiz Naqshbandi, Ms Shamim Shawl, Advocate Parvaiz Ahmad, Dr Waleed Rasool and Advocate Nida Salam.
